

# Profile of Venerable Master Chin Kung AM

Venerable Master Chin Kung AM, born in 1927, is an eminent monk in the Pure Land school of Mahayana Buddhism. In 1959, he was ordained at Linji Temple, Yuanshan, Taipei in 1959, and given the Dharma name Chin Kung, which means "pure emptiness". Since then Venerable Master Chin Kung has lectured on Buddhism for over sixty years.

He is advisor to over 100 Amitabha Buddhist Societies and Pure Land Learning Centres worldwide, and founder of the Pure Land Learning College Association (PLLCA) in



Toowoomba, Australia. Venerable Master Chin Kung also founded the Hwa Dzan Dharma Giving Association, Taiwan; the Hwa Dzan Buddhist Audio-Visual Library, Taiwan; and the Corporate Body of the Buddha Educational Foundation, Taiwan.

Venerable Master Chin Kung pioneered the use of the Internet and satellite television in propagating the Buddha's teachings. His recorded lectures are distributed in books and on DVDs, CDs, and videotapes. He has sponsored the printing and distribution of the Buddhist Canon; Buddhist sutras, books, and images as well as books on moral education. All these are freely distributed worldwide. His Profile of Venerable Master Chin Kung AM 州

lectures are broadcasted live via satellite television and the Internet to audiences around the world.

In recognition of his achievements in building interfaith harmony and fostering world peace, Venerable Master Chin Kung has been awarded a number of honorary doctorate degrees and professorships by various Australian and overseas universities including the University of Oueensland, Griffith University, and the University of Southern Queensland, Australia; and Syarif Hidayatullan State Islamic University, Jakarta, Indonesia. He is the Honorary Founding Patron of the Australian Centre for Peace and Conflict Studies at the University of Queensland.



In 2005, Venerable Master Chin Kung was appointed to the Member of the Order of Australia in the General Division by Queen Elizabeth II. He was recognised for service to the Buddhist community in Queensland, particularly through the propagation of Buddhism and the fostering of interfaith activities between diverse ethnic groups, and to the community through support for educational and health institutions.

In 2006, Venerable Master Chin Kung and the PLLCA were invited by UNESCO to co-organise. the event "Celebrating the 2550th Birth Anniversary of the Buddha" at UNESCO Headquarters, Paris. The subject of the event Profile of Venerable Master Chin Kung AM 🚬

was "Discover the Buddhist Contribution to Humanity", to enable more people to learn from the Buddha how to reconcile conflict and promote social stability and world peace through education. The goal was to prove that through the moral teachings of sages and saints, it is possible to teach people to be good and to teach those of different faiths to live together harmoniously.

In 2009, Venerable Master Chin Kung was appointed as an International Trustee of Religions for Peace, an international peace co-organisation. which is active on every continent. Its mission is to create multireligious partnerships to confront issues such as stopping war, ending poverty, and protecting the earth.

Since the late 1990s, Venerable Master Chin Kung has both initiated and participated in interfaith forums and summits in many countries speaking on the importance of education. He explains that it is imperative that all religious teachers sincerely "learn to be a teacher and act as a role model for all". He encourages these teachers to practice the teachings of the sages and saints in their daily lives, delve deeply into the teachings of their own religions, and humbly learn from other religions.

In December 2011, at the tenyear anniversary celebration of the PLLCA, many faith and community leaders, including the former mayor of Toowoomba, Cr Profile of Venerable Master Chin Kung AM 🚬

Peter Taylor, expressed their wish and support to make Toowoomba a Model City of Peace and Harmony for the whole world. This action is a deeply meaningful and insightful one. It is an endeavour of the highest order. Subsequently, political leaders, including the current Mayor, Cr Paul Antonio, have expressed their full support for this vision of establishing Toowoomba as a Model City of Peace and Harmony.

Venerable Master Chin Kung's teachings can be summed up by the following principles for practice: "true sincerity, purity of mind, equality, proper understanding, compassion, seeing through, letting go,




attaining freedom, according with proper conditions, and being mindful of Amitabha Buddha". His message of loving-kindness and compassion for all has been the central theme of his life-long teaching. Harbouring thoughts of sincerity, respect, humility, and harmony and dedication to help all beings to gain long-lasting happiness and joy has been his meaning of life.





In July 2016, the University of Wales Trinity Saint David awarded the Venerable Master Chin Kung an honorary professsorship, in recognition of his outstanding international leadership and the promotion of interfaith studies in furthering global understanding.

Teaming up with many local Christian and other faith leaders, the centre has hosted numerous conferences, workshops,




events and activities promoting Toowoomba as a Model City of Peace and Harmony.

The 360 Excerpts – A Daily Reflection for Wisdom.







22 If one seeks wisdom, one must achieve a pure mind. When one has a pure mind, wisdom manifests. A pure mind is like a mirror. Its function is to see everything clearly in its reflection.






40 Our learning and practice to become Buddhas and Bodhisattvas are built on the foundation of the humanities.
